

My concern is the inability to determine the overhead clearance of equipment in the field. It is impossible to determine exact distance between an elevated boom and an overhead wire, especially when the overhead wire is not near any tower or other point of reference

The problem of determination is of supreme importance because some electrical companies will not insulate overhead wires while construction is being performed below their wires. They express liability concerns.

Electrical companies are also sometimes hesitant to shut off power for some operations because of contractual agreements which carry an extreme penalty for any interruption of service
